



Utility rights of way are examples of areas that can be disked and seeded.

GUIDELINES FOR FOOD PLOT ESTABLISHMENT

Disking/Seeding

- No disking of ditches on company gravel roads; no disking on the surface of any woods road.
- No disking (between rows, planted banking grounds, etc.) in pine plantations until *after* they have been thinned.
- Disking and seeding in utility rights of way will be allowed if roads are not disturbed. There should be no disking on steep grades (greater than 10%). There should be a grass buffer strip of least 50 feet on creek banks.
- Installation of food plots by disking and seeding will be allowed in banking grounds. Exceptions to this are banking grounds in new clearcuts which will be planted in pine trees.

Bushhogging

- Bushhogging company road ditches and perimeters or fire lines of pine plantations (no wider than 8-10 feet) will be allowed upon approval by Potlatch Resource personnel.
- Bushhogging utility rights of way and woods roads will be allowed.

By complying with these simple guidelines, we can continue to enjoy our forests and its wildlife as well as protect our soil and water resources.
