



FERAL HOGS PRESENT PROBLEMS

Feral (wild) hogs frequently damage newly planted tree seedlings and food plots by rooting. Potlatch hunting leases grant clubs exclusive rights to hunt, take, trap and pursue feral hogs on their lease. However, no feral (wild) hogs are to be released on a Potlatch lease. No night hunting of hogs is allowed on Potlatch lands.

Over the past couple of years, Potlatch has seen an increase in the hog population in several locations on its lands. It is important that the clubs contacted about hog problems use all legal means available to them to reduce the hog population. Getting this situation under control and keeping it under control in the best interest of Potlatch and the hunting clubs.

We encourage clubs to:

1. Notify Potlatch (phone 870-226-1250) should your club encounter severe hog damage in pine plantations.
2. Continue to encourage club members to help in controlling hog populations by trapping, shooting, etc.
3. Inform all club members that releasing hogs on lands leased from Potlatch is a violation of the lease agreement.
